Contraindications to BCG Intravesical Instillation (relative/absolute)

Absolute:

- Breaks in the urogenital epithelium:
 - Traumatic catheterisation (i.e. bleeding)
 - Active infective cystitis
 - · Persistent gross haematuria
 - Resection of bladder tumour within 2 weeks
- Immunosuppression:
 - Combined immunodeficiency (T and B-cell immunodeficiency)
 - T-cell immunodeficiency (e.g. HIV with CD4 count <200, DiGeorge Syndrome)
 - Previous treatment with chemotherapy medications such as Clofarabine, Bendamustine.
 - Recent (e.g. <12 months) treatment with Infliximab,
 Adalimumab or Etanercept (anti-TNF agents)
- Previous BCGosis
- Bone Marrow Transplant within the last 6 months
- Allergy to BCG
- Previous TB
- Pregnant or breastfeeding

Relative

- Immunosuppression:
 - T-cell immunodeficiency
 - Idiopathic CD4 lymphopenia
 - HIV with CD4 count 200-350
 - Chronic lymphocytic leukaemia(7)
 - B-cell/Antibody immunodeficiencies
 - Severe G6PD deficiency(8)
 - Current or recent immunosuppressive treatment. E.g.
 - Prednisolone treatment(7) at ≥10mg dose for ≥2 months within the last year (or equivalent dose of another corticosteroid)(9).
 - Mycophenolate mofetil,
 - Azathioprine
 - Sirolimus
 - Tacrolimus
 - Methotrexate
 - History of systemic chemotherapy such as Rituximab, Cyclophosphamide
