What is the Hospital Learning Disabilities Liaison Nurse Team?

We are a team of Registered Learning Disabilities Nurses employed by Sirona Care and Health and work within Southmead Hospital.

We provide support across the whole of Southmead Hospital to People with a Learning Disability over the age of 16; who have been assessed as having a Learning Disability by their local Community Learning Disabilities Team (CLDT).

Our Aim: is to offer effective and efficient support to adults with a Learning Disability whilst at Southmead Hospital.

What we do:

- Advise hospital staff of any reasonable adjustment required for the individuals appointment, treatment or stay in hospital.
- Work using person centred approaches.
- Provide advice and support to other professionals within Southmead Hospital regarding learning disability issues.
- Promote access to Southmead Hospital
- Ensure people with a learning disability have access to all the information they need whilst in hospital.
- Ensure safe discharge arrangements have been made.

Support We can offer:

- We can assess the patient's learning disability needs for equal access to healthcare.
- We have pain charts and assessments, risk assessments, other useful tools and information for staff.
- We can provide accessible information and communication aids for the patient.
- We can spend time with the patient to explain things and to ensure they understand what is happening.
- We have links with all local Community Learning Disability Teams (CLDT) and main care providers.
- We can support patients at outpatient appointments, day surgery, or help plan an admission.
- We can facilitate equal access to healthcare for people with a learning disability
- We can assess people's needs with regards to their admission to hospital to identify any reasonable adjustments that need to be implemented.
- We can provide a 'Patient Profile' to identify and highlight needs to ward staff.
- We can facilitate hospital visits prior to admission.
- We can liaise with both medical and nursing professions regarding needs.
- We support and advise hospital staff regarding capacity and consent
