What is the training?

A day of free training looking into the world of low-tech communication aids, from PODD to PECS, Alphabet Charts to Auditory Scanning.

This training is aimed at Speech and Language Therapists, Teachers, Teaching Assistants, Support workers and other professionals working with people who do, or could, use low-tech AAC.

What happens on the day?

A day of practical training focused on how to choose the right low-tech communication method, how to create low-tech communication aids and how to implement their use in everyday environments.

The day will be as practical as possible and we will send you home with lots of ideas for how to implement low-tech AAC with the individuals you work with.
