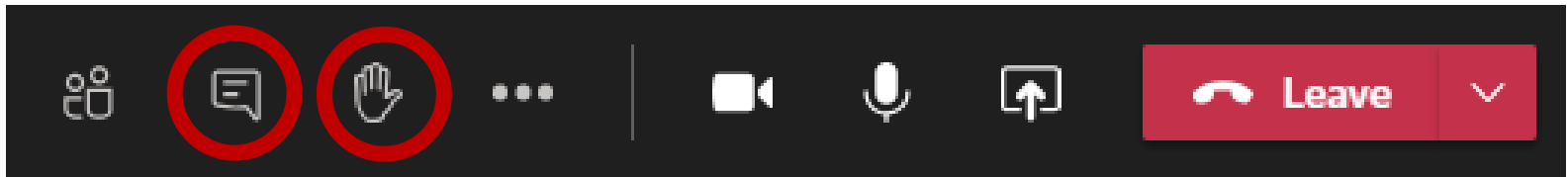

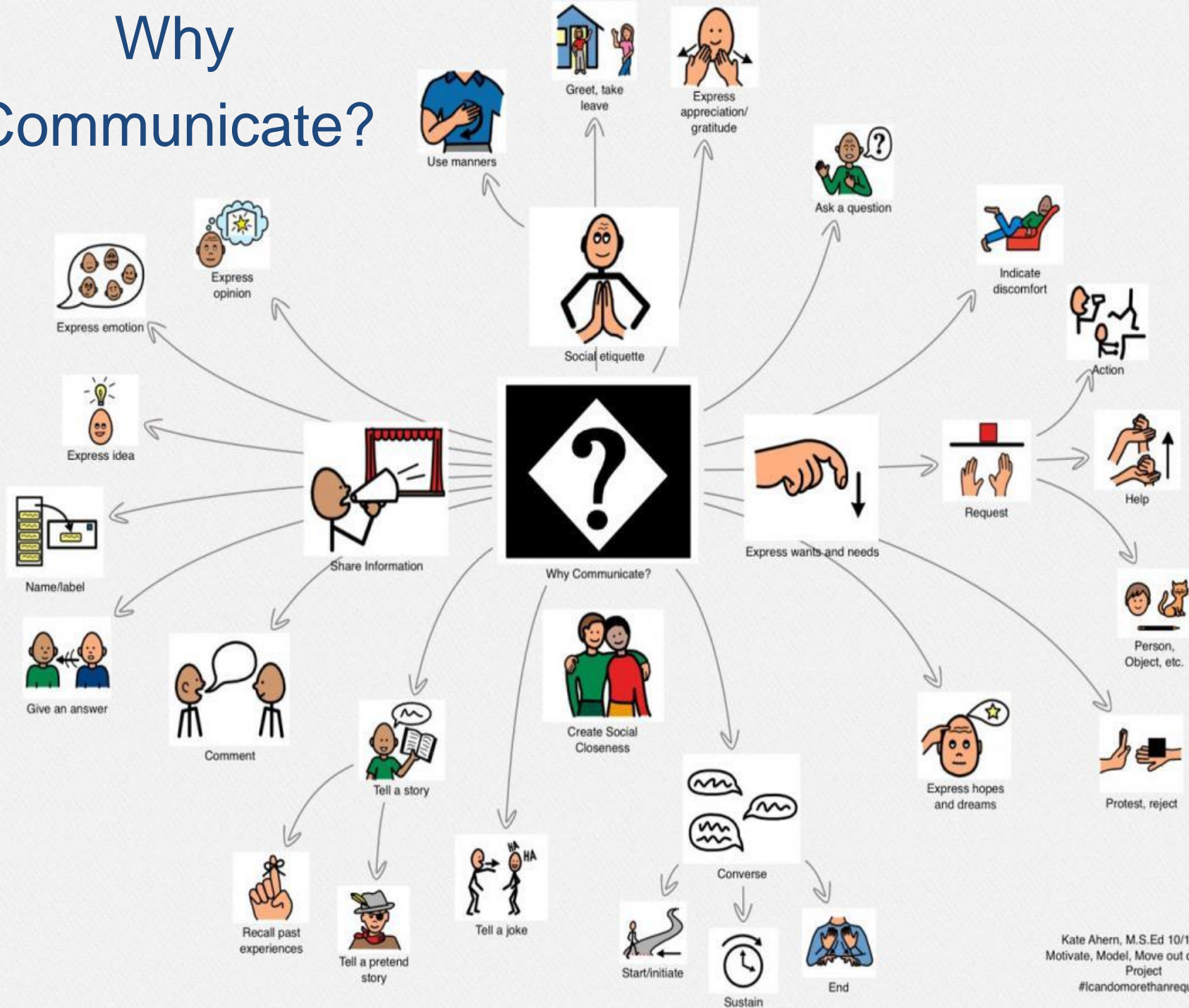

The Challenge

A person using AAC:

- **can only say the words, or utilise the ‘pragmatic functions’, that someone else has chosen to make available to them**
- **may only learn to use the words and functions that they are shown how to use**
(see modelling training)

Our Goal

For everyone to be able to say what they want, when they want to say it, to the person they want to say it to

To achieve this, we need to make sure we provide access to

- as many words to say as possible
- words that they can use in lots of different situations
- words that they can use for lots of different reasons

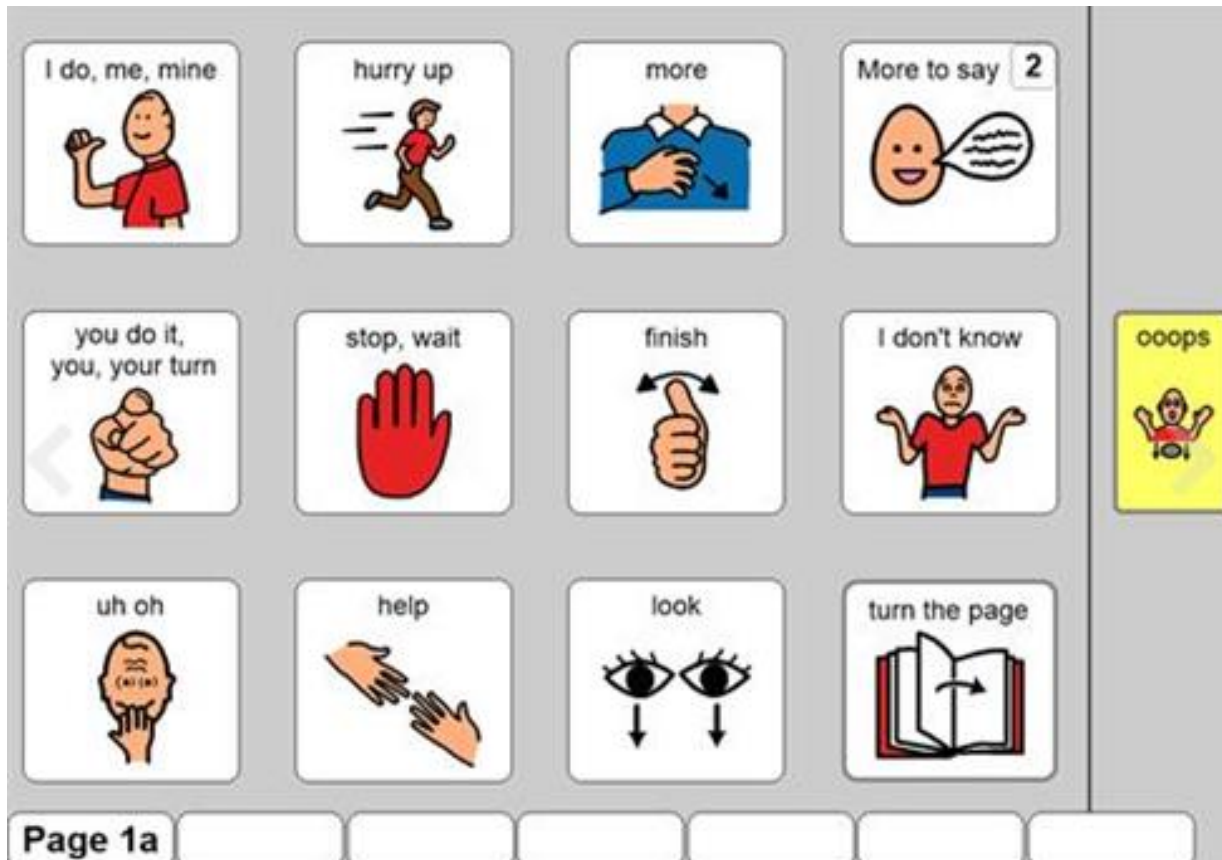

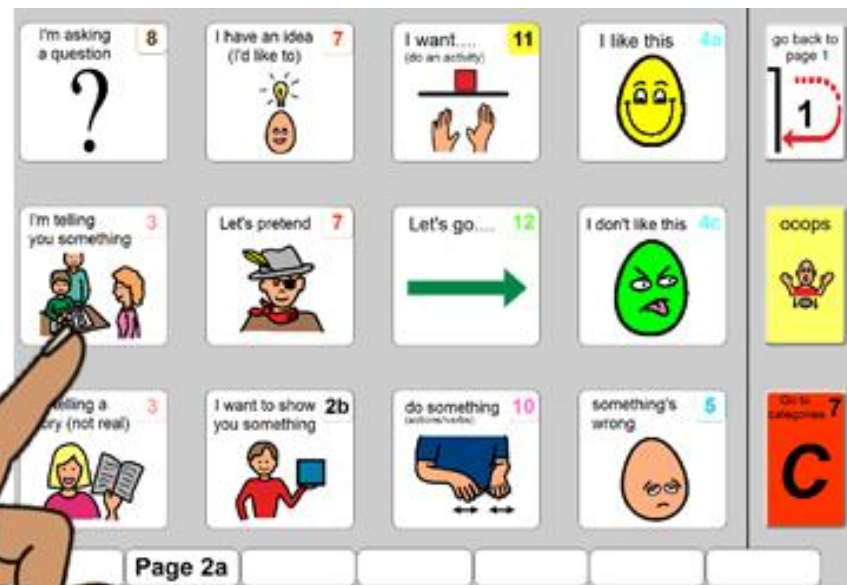
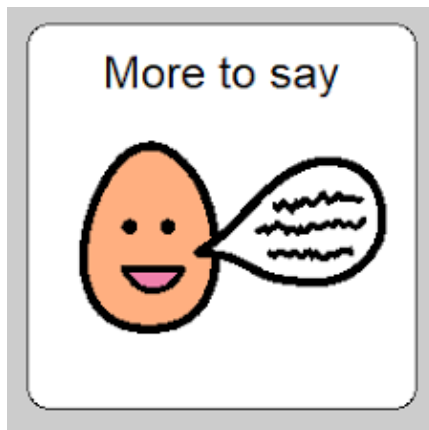
Quick Chat

All day long. No matter the activity. Most useful words.



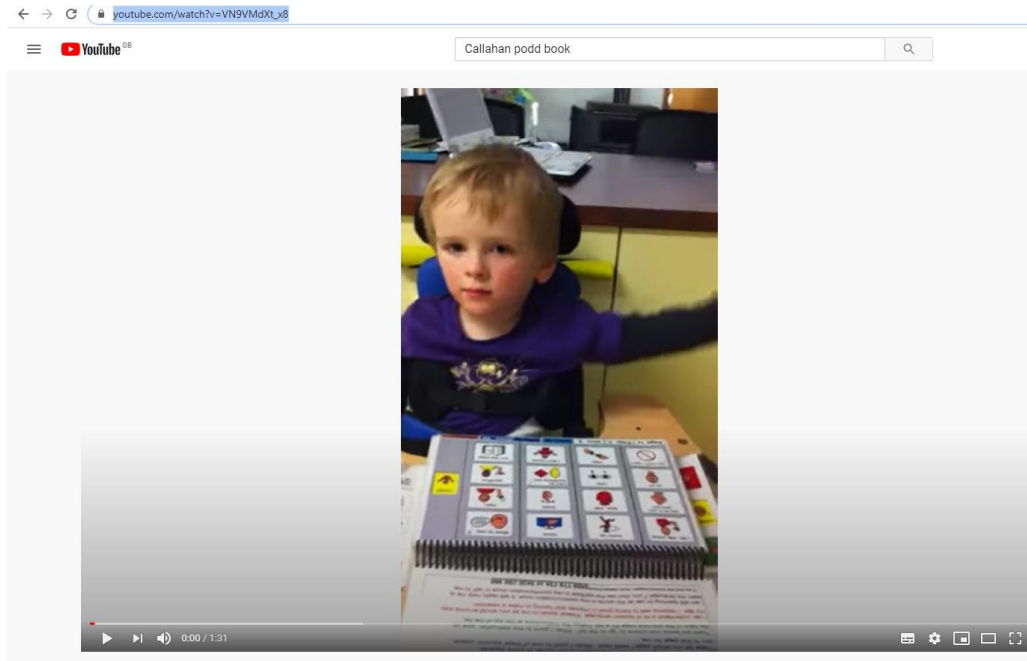
Pragmatic Starters

What's your reason for communicating? This is where you begin to build your message.



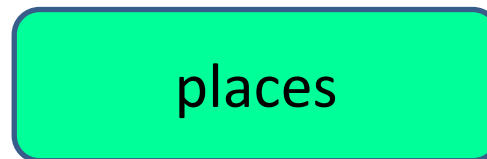
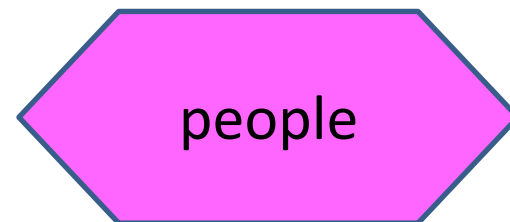
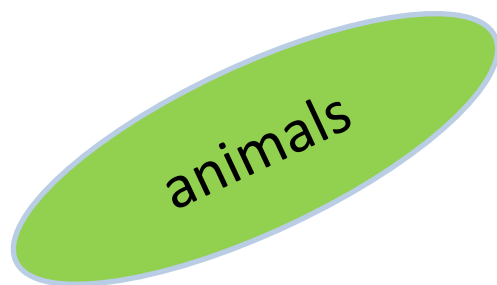
